OFFICE MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT: MULTILATERAL / BILATERAL TRAINING PROGRAM UNDER CHINA AID IN JULY 2026

The undersigned is directed to state that the Government of the People's Republic of China has offered different Multilateral/ Bilateral Trainings/ Seminars for the month of July, 2026, for officers of the Government of Pakistan (**List of Multilateral and Bilateral programs and Details of Multilateral (I and II) and Bilateral programs are attached**). The Chinese side has further informed that the candidate **cannot be withdrawn, once nominated**. The Government of Pakistan will not be liable to bear any cost. The requisite general requirements are as under:

Eligibility Criteria

- Officers (**BS-17 & above**) of Ministries/ Divisions and Provincial Governments, most relevant to the training programme;
- Proficiency in English;
- **Under 50 for officials at director general's level and under 45 for officials at or under director's level;**
- **Contract Employees are not eligible.**

- No criminal record certificate or Police Clearance Certificate attested (**apostille**) by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Pakistan, if not visited China within last 5 years;
- FTC Proforma;
- Copy of CNIC;
- Surety Bond on stamp paper (**Original**);
- Undertaking on stamp paper (**Original**);
- No Objection Certificate.

2. The relevant Ministries/ Divisions and Provincial P & D Departments must note the following points while nominating the candidates:

1. Most relevant candidates should be nominated for the Multilateral/ Bilateral programme.
2. Nomination of candidates should reach EAD before the deadline. Late arrival of nomination, after EAD's deadline, will not be entertained.

3. Nomination papers, complete in all respects, should be forwarded to EAD through proper channel i.e. through the respective Administrative Ministry/ Division/ P&D Department.
4. All candidates must follow the code of conduct (**Annex-I**).

(1) Participants will visit the Kunming Area of China (Yunnan) Pilot Free Trade Zone, Yunnan Tengjin Logistics Co., Ltd. (Tengjun International Land Port), and other sites to learn about Yunnan's experience in the construction and operation of logistics hubs open to the Indian Ocean.

(2) Participants will visit Xiamen, Fujian Province, for economic and cultural exchanges to gain a first-hand understanding of the free trade pilot zone's advanced achievements and practical experience in institutional innovation, opening-up, and investment promotion, and to explore the practical paths for the integrated development of smart port construction and the blue economy.

III. Lecturer Profile

(1) Lu Chunmei: Associate Professor at the School of Foreign Languages and South Asian and Southeast Asian Studies, Yunnan Minzu University. Her research focuses on translation theory and practice, foreign language teaching reform, the cultivation of foreign language professionals for South and Southeast Asia, and cross-cultural translation. She has led several provincial-level education science planning projects.

(2) Li Xiaoxia: Deputy Director of the Publicity Department and Associate Professor at Yunnan University of Finance and Economics, also serving as Vice Chairwoman of the

university's Women's Federation. Her research and practice primarily focus on university news publicity and campus culture construction, ideological and political education for college students, and language arts and speech dissemination.

(3) Lu Yaqin: Professor and Master's Supervisor at the Economic Research Institute, Yunnan University of Finance and Economics. In 2014, it was approved as a training base for international business officials by the Ministry of Commerce.</p> <p>Its current primary responsibilities include: organizing and hosting overseas aid training programs commissioned by the Ministry of Commerce and the People's Government of Yunnan Province, as well as various training courses for the Yunnan provincial commerce system; organizing international exchanges to strengthen bilateral and multilateral mutually beneficial cooperation; coordinating and managing various international development cooperation projects carried out by relevant international organizations in Yunnan Province, and being responsible for the centralized management of the project during its implementation; and providing evidence and support for government and corporate decision-making through training, research, and consulting services.</p> <p>As of April 2026, the Center has successfully hosted 239 foreign aid training programs organized by the Ministry of Commerce, training a cumulative total of 5,894 government officials and technical experts from 115 countries. These training programs have covered approximately 20 fields, including commerce and trade, public administration and social organization, finance, agriculture, forestry, animal husbandry, and fisheries, transportation and logistics, and healthcare. Over the past decade of organizing overseas aid training programs, the Center has established a comprehensive operational mechanism for such initiatives and maintained long-term cooperative relationships with relevant institutions both within and outside the province, thereby providing robust resource support to ensure the smooth implementation of these programs.</p>

4) Blockchain Technology Theory, Applications and Cooperation for RCEP: This session provides a systematic introduction to the fundamental theories and application scenarios of blockchain technology, with a focus on practical applications in cross-border trade, supply chain traceability, cross-border payments, and customs clearance facilitation. It explores opportunities and pathways for cooperation between China and ASEAN in the digital economy and blockchain industry under the RCEP framework, offering technical guidance for participants to engage in regional industrial capacity cooperation and digital cross-border business.

5) Marketing Places—Attracting Investment, Industry and Tourism: Attracting investment, promoting industrial development, and increasing tourism revenue through effective marketing strategies, helping participants understand how to enhance local economic vitality and production capacity.

6) Risk Management Strategies for Engineering Projects and Sharing China's Experience: Risk management is a critical component of engineering projects. This lecture will introduce risk management strategies in project management and share China's experience.

7) Yunnan's Development of Indian Ocean Corridors and Opening to the Outside World: Aligning with the national Indian Ocean strategy, this session will analyze the current status of Yunnan's land-sea corridor development, assess opportunities for opening along the border, and plan new frameworks for economic and trade cooperation with South and Southeast Asia.

8) Cross-Border E-Commerce Empowering SMEs for Leapfrog Development: Focusing on new business models in cross-border e-commerce, this session will analyze the challenges SMEs face when going abroad, explain how platforms can empower businesses, and assist enterprises in expanding into international markets and achieving quality upgrades.

(2) Cultural Experience

1) Participants will experience the hand-molding and painting of Huishan clay figurines. Under the guidance of intangible cultural heritage inheritors, they will knead clay, shape figures, and apply colors to create their own "Da A Fu"—a traditional auspicious clay figurine in areas south of the Yangtze River—and experience the profound heritage and craftsmanship of Wuxi's traditional arts and crafts.

2) Participants will experience the traditional craftsmanship of hand-made Yixing purple clay teapots, learning basic techniques such as kneading clay, rolling sheets, and shaping. This immersive experience will allow them to appreciate China's purple clay pottery culture and recognize the international promotional value of cultural and creative industries in areas south of the Yangtze River.

II. Visits (subject to change based on actual circumstances)

(1) Visit Tengjun International Land Port: conducting on-site research into the operation of multimodal international freight trains connecting China, Laos, Thailand, and Myanmar, as well as the development model of cross-border logistics hubs; learning from experiences in cross-border supply chains and supporting services for expanding production capacity to Indian Ocean nations.

(2) Visit the New Energy Smart Manufacturing Industrial Park in the Central Yunnan New Area: investigating green lithium-ion battery manufacturing and the layout of the new energy equipment industrial chain, and discussing pathways for capacity cooperation and technology transfer in the green energy sector between China and Indian Ocean nations.

(3) Visit TAILG Technology Group (Headquarter in Wuxi): touring the intelligent manufacturing workshop for new energy electric vehicles and the overseas market exhibition hall, and learning about the full industrial chain layout for green transportation equipment and proven experience in localized capacity cooperation in the Indian Ocean market.

(4) Visit Wuxi No.1 Cotton Mill: investigating intelligent production in high-end textiles and models for cross-border textile trade capacity export, and exchanging practices on international capacity cooperation and supply chain synergy in the light industry.

(5) Visit Wuxi Internet of Things Innovation Promotion Center: examining achievements in industrial IoT and intelligent manufacturing-driven industrial upgrading, and exploring new

pathways for digital technology to empower manufacturing transformation and capacity cooperation in Indian Ocean countries.

III. Lecturer Profile

(1)Pang Chunping: Director of the Human Resources Office at Yunnan University of Finance and Economics; recipient of the National Digital Education Demonstration Excellence Award for teaching and research achievements. He oversees the recruitment and development of high-level talent, faculty training, performance-based compensation, and personnel system reform. He leads inter-institutional research on human resources management, and organizes professional development programs for key faculty members. He also coordinates the advancement of talent team development in higher education;

(2)Yu Yong: Director of the International Cooperation and Exchange Office, Yunnan University of Finance and Economics; Professor. His research focuses on regional economic development, cross-border economic cooperation, RCEP regional cooperation, and foreign investment. He has led research projects funded by the National Natural Science Foundation of China and others, published multiple monographs, and authored numerous papers in core journals and authoritative theoretical publications, with a deep focus on China–South Asia and Southeast Asia regional cooperation research.

(3)Yu Dongping: Professor at Yunnan University of Finance and Economics. He has long led the construction and operation of e-government and information platforms across the provincial industry and information technology system, spearheaded the implementation of digital transformation projects for industrial enterprises, and has made significant contributions to the application of industrial information technology and digital economy technologies in Yunnan.

 - Personal space should be respected during conversation and a comfortable distance should be maintained.
 - Personal remarks on their dress and appearance should be avoided.
 - Loose language or inappropriate terms should not be used.
 - Inappropriate jokes should not be cracked.

- Hand gestures universally deemed obscene should not be made.
- Staring should be strictly avoided.
- Situations that make female colleagues uncomfortable should be avoided.
- While talking to a female, hands should never be placed in trousers pockets.
- Personal questions should never be asked (age, height, weight, marital status etc).
- Ordinarily, men should open the door for women.
- Females should always precede a male while entering a room.
- Door of a car should be opened for a female colleague.

11. Psychological harassment is against Chinese norms, that shall strictly be avoided:

- a. Persistent, unjustified and unnecessary negative attacks on personal or professional performance;
- b. Manipulation of an employee's personal or professional reputation by rumor, gossip or ridicule;
- c. Offensive comments or behavior relating to the ethnic origin, physical characteristics or religion of an individual;
- d. Exclusion or continued isolation from professional activities;
