Subject: Nomination of Officers for Certification Trainings under CIPFA in Public Sector Chartered Accountancy and Short Courses in Audit Specializations

As a major step forward towards enhancing professional capacity of this organization, DAGP has initiated a project aimed at training (a) 150 officers of the Auditor General Office in public sector-chartered accountancy (b) 800 auditors in IPSAS (c) up to 800 auditors in short courses pertaining to selected thematic areas(see Annexure-I).

2. All mentioned courses shall be imparted through the prestigious Chartered Institute of Public Finance and Accountancy (CIPFA) in collaboration with University of Lahore, and successful trainees shall be awarded certification from CIPFA, based on the respective stages of training cleared by them.

3. The trainings will be imparted through a combination of online and class room-based sessions (see Annexure I for details of training duration and eligibility).
4. The IPSAS course will be imparted to 800 trainees. Those who successfully complete the IPSAS training will be given preference for nominations in short thematic audit courses.
5. Short thematic audit courses will be held subsequent to the IPSAS training. These courses will on average span 70 hours of training in a selected thematic area. An officer can opt for a maximum of three courses from the list of courses as listed in the Annexure-1. In case of a clash of choice in opted courses, preference will be given to those officers who perform better in IPSAS training. Professionally recognized certificates will be awarded by CIPFA on successful completion.
6. The flagship, internationally recognized, CIPFA training in public sector chartered accountancy will require more intensive and sustained commitment from candidates with intermittent training sessions spread over 24 months. On successful completion of course and clearance of exam the candidates will acquire the qualification of a public sector Chartered Accountant. The course will pass through stages. Successful completion of each stage will provide candidate with a certification award or diploma.
7. Nomination forms for CIPFA Chartered Accountancy training and IPSAS training (Annexures II & III) may be got filled and sent to this office within 7 working days. For thematic audit training, nominations will be invited separately. However, a prospective candidate must state his top three preferences from the list of courses at Annexure I.
8. Nominees for respective courses will be expected to display highest level of professionalism and commitment in ensuring successful attendance and completion of coursework. Any lapse in this regard may invite action under E&D Rules.
9. All officers are encouraged to apply for the trainings and become part of this transformative change towards upgrading of human resource capacity of the DAGP.

General Guidelines

DAGP being the Supreme Audit Institution of the country has a critical role in improving PFM systems through ensuring transparency and accountability, and thereby contributing to good governance in the country. To fulfill this role, it is imperative for DAGP to enhance its capacity through use of technology, training of human resources to bring professional capabilities at par with international standards, and effective change management. Accordingly, DAGP has initiated a project titled “Implementation and Mainstreaming of AMIS.” One of its components include “Capacity Development of DAGP’s Human Resource” as per international auditing standards.

It has two sub-components:

1. Chartered accountancy qualification

To enable effective financial auditing, DAGP chartered accountancy training would be provided to 150 candidates. On successful completion of the training modules and other requirements, individuals may then be awarded the Full Chartered Membership of CIPFA.

The details of training are provided in the following Table:

Eligibility Criteria for Chartered Accountancy Qualification

- ✓ PA&AS officers in BS-17 to 20 below the age of 55 years.
- ✓ Departmental Cadre staff of DAGP/Audit below the age of 55 years.

2. Thematic areas certifications

Certifiable training courses would be provided to 800 candidates with a focus on performance audit. This sub-component has two levels.

i. Level 1: IPSAS

Basic certification in IPSAS to 800 nominated individuals.
